This includes building adaptation capacity in Indigenous communities by supporting needs and acknowledging different ways of knowing. This aims to further reconciliation and prepare communities for the future. The intent is to create a space to share ideas, identify needs, leverage ongoing work, and build capacity for these communities in years to come.

Some ways this is done is by providing climate data for communities, presentations at events and various other engagement activities, hosting events and working groups, collaborating on funding opportunities, ensuring that resources being developed represent the reality in Labrador, and providing opportunities to leverage Labrador priorities and ongoing work on a regional scale.

It is a rewarding role— building relationships with local stakeholders and rights holders, learning from them, and working together to address the unique climate challenges that are faced here in Labrador. As a climate services specialist, it's not just about the data or the science—it's about the people.
